

#### Forensic Examination Objective

Perform measurements that are admissible in court, support admissible expert testimony, and provide high confidence technical assessments for attribution.

#### Certified Reference Materials

- Certified Reference Materials (CRMs) support:
  - Radiochemical analytical method validation and certification;
  - Application of standards and controls within the analytical environment;
  - Traceability of forensics measurements to known values;
    and
  - Competency and proficiency of forensic examiners.



#### Types of R/N Forensic Examinations

- Smuggling/interdiction of radiological/nuclear (R/N) material
- Lost/stolen radiation sources
- Radiological Dispersal Devices
- Radiological Exposure Devices
- Improvised Nuclear Devices
- Nuclear forensics (post-nuclear detonation attribution)





#### **Analytical Methods**

- Plutonium dating
- Simulants (nuclear fall-out debris)
- Fission product measurements
- Identify mis-labeled radiological materials



- CRM allows the FBI to perform measurements that are admissible in court and support admissible expert testimony.
- High confidence technical assessments for attribution.
